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Update on Additional Duties for Imports from India

U.S. Customs and Border Protection has issued updated guidance regarding additional duties on imports from India. For goods entered for consumption or withdrawn from warehouse on or after **12:01 a.m. Eastern Time on February 7, 2026**, the additional 25 percent ad valorem duty previously imposed under HTSUS 9903.01.84 through 9903.01.89 is no longer in effect. This change follows implementation updates to the Presidential Executive Order titled [“Modifying Duties to Address Threats to the United States by the Government of the Russian Federation”](#)

As a result, importers will no longer be subject to the additional 25 percent duty under this specific provision for qualifying entries made on or after that date. However, reciprocal tariffs imposed under Executive Order 14257, [“Regulating Imports with a Reciprocal Tariff to Rectify Trade Practices That Contribute to Large and Persistent Annual United States Goods Trade Deficits”](#) remain in effect for products that do not qualify for an exemption.

If entries were filed on or after February 7, 2026 and included the additional 25 percent duty under the affected HTSUS provisions, corrections may be required. Importers may be eligible to file a Post Summary Correction to request a refund, or in the case of liquidated entries, file a protest within 180 days of liquidation.
